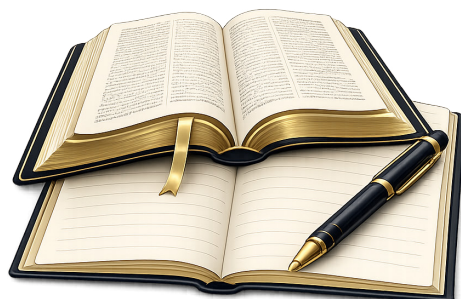

This Bible reading program is unique in that it strives for a flow of thought and context while accenting timely Biblical teachings, important Biblical events and the Biblical Feasts of the LORD. Scheduled to coincide with the Torah Portions each Sabbath and the rest of the Bible on the remaining days of the week, the Daily Bible Reading Journal will cover the entire Bible over the course of a year.

The Torah Portions read each Sabbath. The first five books of the Bible are known as the Torah. The Torah is traditionally divided into 54 portions and is read each Sabbath over the course of a year, beginning just after Sukkot (also known as the Feast of Tabernacles). 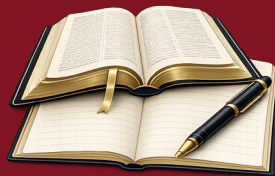
